## KIRKWOOD COMMUNITY COLLEGE Meeting of the Board of Trustees Thursday, July 14, 2022, 4:30 P.M. The Hotel at Kirkwood Center

#### **MINUTES**

Chair Mollenhauer called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

Trustees Thys and Pearson moved and seconded approval of the minutes from the meeting held on June 9, 2022, and directed them to be made a part of the permanent record. Motion carried: 6-0.

Trustees Stamp and Caves moved and seconded approval of the July 14, 2022 agenda. Motion carried: 6-0.

#### **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

### **Kirkwood Report**

Justin Hoehn, Director of Media and Legislative Relations, provided the Eagle Update and Kirkwood report, which included:

- Kirkwood is a leading, globally-respected 2-year college that has helped more than 200,000 alumni reach
  their collegiate goals and dreams for over 50 years. Kirkwood offers SO much more than associate degrees
  to the seven-county area it serves. The college is a vital cog in the economic and social wellbeing of the
  community. Put simply, Kirkwood is life changing for those wanting to invest in their futures. This
  academic year, 243 students earned a high school equivalency diploma at Kirkwood.
- The Hotel at Kirkwood Center is no stranger to winning awards. In 2021, the Iowa Tourism Office awarded The Hotel their Outstanding Metro Lodging Property award—a major statewide recognition. The Hotel was recently named the 2022 Best Banquet/Event Facility by the Corridor Business Journal as part of the publication's Best of the Corridor Survey. The Hotel also recently received the AAA Four Diamond Award, making it the only AAA Four-Diamond-rated hotel in Cedar Rapids and one of only four hotels in the state with that distinction. This is the 11th consecutive year the organization has received the award and it signifies The Hotel continues to be among the most elegant establishments in the entire state of Iowa.
- Student of the Month is Phuong Tran. She is an international student from Saigon, Vietnam. She attended Cedar Valley Christian School in Cedar Rapids. Her family is back home in Vietnam. Phuong was introduced to Kirkwood by the Admissions staff that visited her school. She is a Liberal Arts student and Kirkwood is a great way to fulfill many of her pre-med courses. Phuong is set to graduate in the Spring of 2023 and plans to get a bachelor's degree in psychology before heading to med school.
- Mercy Medical Center is giving our Nursing students more financial resources while they're in school and additional opportunities when they graduate. The program is called Mercy Earn & Learn.
- The college hosted State Representative Tracy Ehlert on main campus for a visit. She currently represents
  parts of southwest Cedar Rapids and western Linn County, serves on the Appropriations, Education,
  Human Resources and Labor Committees, and is the ranking member on the Education Appropriations
  Subcommittee. Representative Ehlert previously attended Kirkwood and was interested in learning more
  about our English as a Second Language program as well as our new Early Childhood Academy.

- Kirkwood and TrueNorth held an event on main campus called Day in the Life of a Driver at the Kirkwood
  Continuing Education Center. Designed for TrueNorth employees who work with the transportation
  industry, the training gives attendees an opportunity to broaden their knowledge and understanding of
  the business they work with on a daily basis.
- Kirkwood has been awarded the Title II Fund for Paraeducator Certification Grant, as part of the Iowa Department of Education's Teach and Paraeducator Registered Apprenticeship Grant Program.

## Strategic Plan/Accreditation Update

Megan Thole, Director of Institutional Planning, provided an update on FY2022 Institutional Student Success outcomes and new institutional key performance indicators for FY2023. The FY2022 Enrollment goal of 250,000 credit hours was not met by approximately 20,000 cr. hrs., resulting in a lower FY2023 goal of 234,000 credit hours, a 2% increase over the previous year's actual. Persistence remained static while PT Student Completion dropped, and Retention/FT Student Completion has continued to trend upward. All remaining metrics are trending positively. Connie Thurman, Vice President of Institutional Effectiveness, provided a status of the Higher Learning Commission's Comprehensive visit to be held October 2-3, 2023, and a Multiple Location visit to be held at two locations, lowa City Campus, and the Continuing Education Training Center, during the FY2023 academic year, at a time yet to be determined.

### **Summer 2022 Enrollment Update**

Jon Buse, Vice President of Student Services, provided an update on summer 2022 term based on the weekly enrollment report prepared by Institutional Effectiveness on July 11, 2022.

Summer 2022 enrollment is 3,952 students enrolled in 22,922 credit hours. Student headcount decreased by 3% and credit hours decreased by 1% over the previous summer term (2021). Enrollment in concurrent enrollment grew by 17% over the previous summer term although concurrent enrollment is very small during the summer.

Buse noted that fall enrollment activities are well underway with new student orientation sessions occurring several days each week. As of July 11, 2022, fall enrollment is 9% above last year at this time. Applications for admission are also ahead of 2021 and running just over 12% above the fall 2021 term. Teams continue to work actively on new student recruitment and academic departments are conducting outreach activities to current and former students.

Buse stated he is encouraged by the fall enrollment numbers thus far and noted that there is still a great deal of time for the enrollment numbers to fluctuate. Buse noted that the areas of greatest gain thus far in fall enrollment are among new students, particularly students age 23 and under and concurrent enrollment. Thus far enrollment among students ages 24-29 and Pell eligible students are two sub-groups showing the largest decline from fall 2021.

## **Financial Report**

Treasurer Choate provided an update on the year end closing process and indicated that previous year end result expectations have not changed. A detailed discussion followed related to the FY23 budget identifying status and two key items that have had an impact on finalizing the budget. The two items are an improvement in FY23 budgeted credit revenues due to enrollment expected to flat or better rather than the previously planned decline of 3% and finalizing the FY23 personnel budget due to impacts of the early retirement program. The detailed FY23 operating budget will be brought to the August board meeting for approval. Discussion was had on the College donating up to \$18 million to the Kirkwood Foundation as a result of the HEERF funding and College cash/fund balance levels. The impact of the donation on the College fund balance was discussed and as shown in the table below the unrestricted current fund balance will still be \$11.3 million higher after the donation than the 2019 level that was the last "pre-pandemic" period.

The College cash position remains strong and will be at 104 days of reserve after the donation compared to the College KPI of 75 days.
