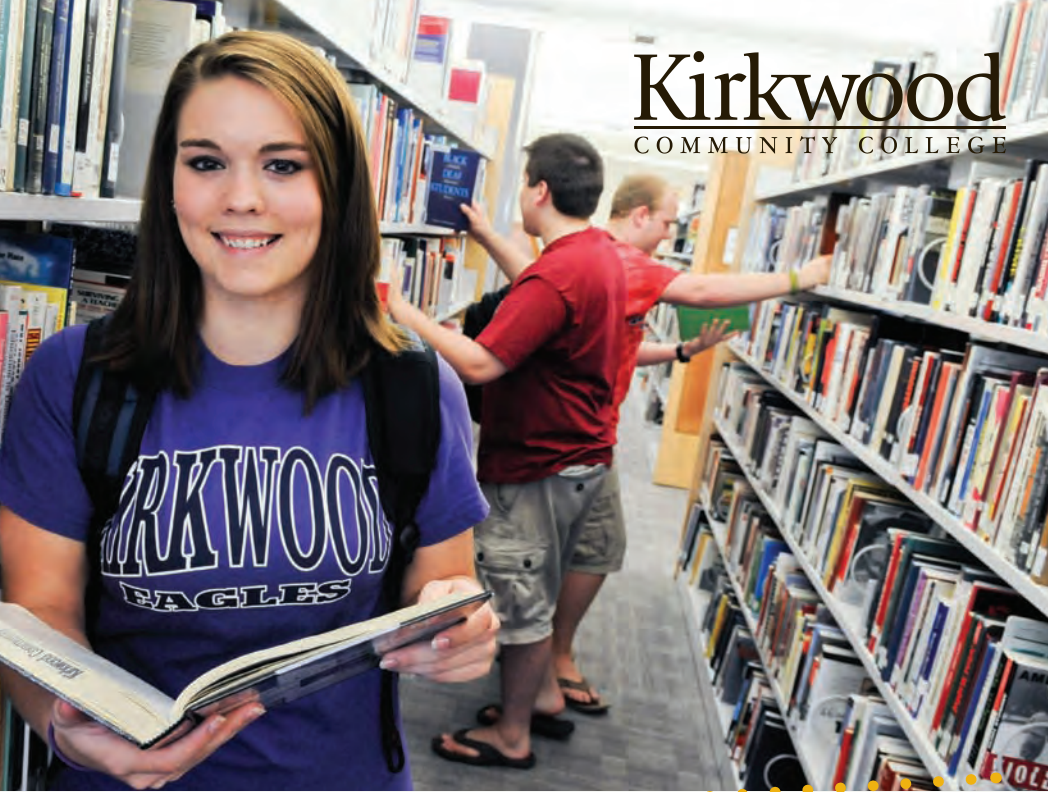

REGISTRATION PRIORITY FOR CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS

You will be notified through the mail and email of when you can register. If you're currently enrolled at Kirkwood, you are allowed to register early, depending on how many credits you've earned. Priority is based upon the total number of credits earned to date.

To get your first choice of classes, and some good advice about what courses are best for you, see your advisor and register during Priority Registration, November 14–18.

APPLYING FOR ADMISSION

Go to www.kirkwood.edu/apply.
Click "New Student Application."
Follow the prompts, entering the correct information.
ACT scores or our placement exams are required for admission.

SEARCHING FOR CLASSES

If you have not yet applied for admission to Kirkwood, you can still search for classes to see what we have available.

1. Go to www.kirkwood.edu and click "EagleNet" at the bottom right of the screen.
2. Choose EagleNet for Guests.
3. Click "Search for Sections."
4. Select a term and location in which you would like to search for classes. Select from the list of subjects in which you are interested. When you are done selecting your options, click "Submit" at the bottom of the page. A list of available classes and times will appear.

BEFORE REGISTERING

It is recommended that all new students meet with an advisor before registration. Once you've applied to Kirkwood, received a student identification number, or "k number," (example: k0003750) and established your password, follow these steps to register.

1. Go to www.kirkwood.edu and click "EagleNet" at the bottom right of screen.
2. Log into "EagleNet for Students" using your k number and password.
 - After you have logged in, click "EagleNet for Students."
3. **Degree Audit:** The Degree Audit function in EagleNet helps you determine what classes you still need to complete your degree.
 - Go to the Academic Planning section and click "Degree Audit."
 - Select your program and click "Submit."
 - To see how your credits transfer to different programs, select the desired program from "What if I changed my program of study?" and click "Submit."
 - After you register for classes, run a Degree Audit to confirm you are registered for the correct classes for your program.
4. Meet with an advisor. He or she will use your Degree Audit to determine what classes to take based on your specific situation.

REGISTERING FOR CLASSES ONLINE:

Under "Registration," you can search for sections.

Click "Search/Register" for sections.

- Select a term in which you would like to search for classes.
- Select from the list of subjects in which you are interested.
- Click "Submit."
- Select open classes by clicking on the box under the "Select" heading.
- On the next page, choose "Register" from the drop down menu under the "Action" heading.
- You must also check the box to certify you have read the terms and conditions of registration.
- Click submit. You are now registered and have a bill. To see your bill, go to "My Bill by Term" in EagleNet.
- Another confirmation page appears—read and click "ok."
- A confirmation email will be sent to your student email account.

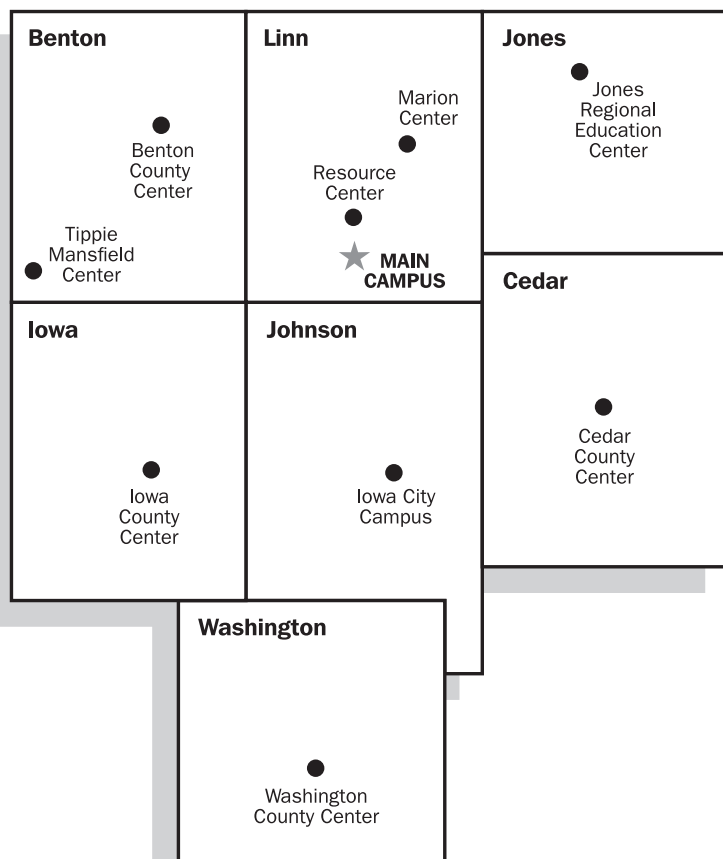

County Centers

Kirkwood operates learning centers in each county of the college's service area. Each center offers a large selection of college credit courses, making it possible for a student to earn an associate of arts degree at a location close to home. Besides college credit courses, each center provides continuing education classes, high school completion programs and GED testing services.

Kirkwood Telecommunications System (KTS) uses interactive television to bring college credit courses to our seven-county service area. Faculty interact with students at each location via microphones and TV cameras in the classrooms.

Testing Requirements

As of January 2012, all new students registering for more than six credit hours are required to take the Compass test prior to registration, unless they meet one of the following exemptions: (Allow at least two weeks for these exemptions to be evaluated.)

- Earned a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college.
- Successfully completed (C or better) college-level math and writing classes at a regionally accredited college.
- Completed the Compass test or ACT and sent the official record of scores to Kirkwood. Math scores are considered valid for two years while reading and writing scores are valid for three years.

Kirkwood Community College uses assessment data to increase student success and overall institutional effectiveness.

Assessment data, combined with thoughtful interpretation by faculty, staff and administrators, allows the college to make high quality decisions related to instruction and institutional priorities. Due to the importance of the assessment process, the Compass placement test is offered for free at all Kirkwood locations, as well as partner institutions in Iowa and across the nation (charges may apply at other institutions).

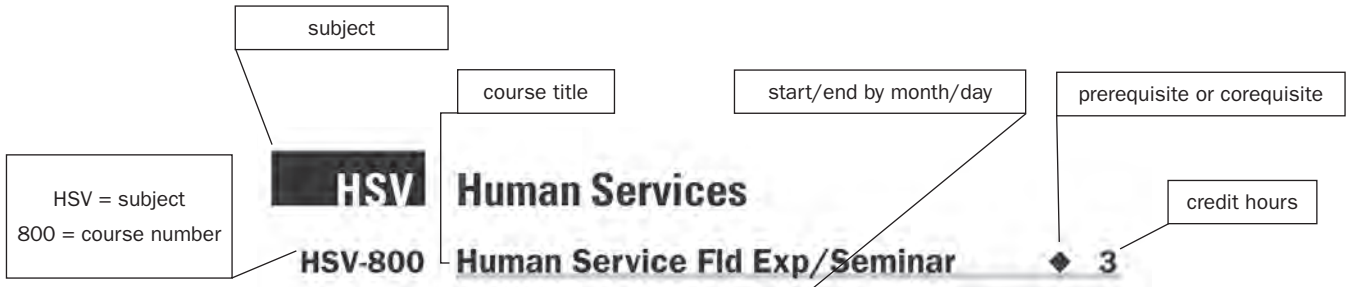

Arts and Sciences students can complete their two-year degrees and then transfer to four-year colleges or universities to complete their bachelor degrees.

Three degrees are awarded in the Arts and Sciences:

- Associate of Arts (A.A.)
- Associate of Science (A.S.)
- Associate of Science/Career Option (A.S./C.O.)

While degree requirements vary according to program area, each degree includes the core courses outlined here. For details on program requirements, please refer to the Kirkwood college catalog.

Students who plan to transfer should work closely with the Advising and Transfer Center regarding the transfer of Arts and Sciences degrees and to facilitate the transfer process.

Electives

Electives are transferable courses required by all three Arts and Sciences degrees. They provide students opportunities to explore subjects of special interest outside of the core requirements, or may be applied to the major students plan to pursue.

Electives are offered each semester in most departments. The following types of courses can be counted as electives:

- All courses with "Arts & Sciences Elective Code A" in the course description. (*transfer courses*)
- Up to 16 credit hours of courses with "Arts & Sciences Elective Code B" in the course description. (*technical courses*)
- Only 2 credit hours of courses with "Arts & Sciences Elective Code D" in the course description. (*developmental courses*)

Students in special or Career Option programs may be required to take specific courses to satisfy their program/Career Option requirements.

INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS

Tuition payment plan is available to students who wish to pay their tuition in installments throughout the semester. This is not a loan program, and there are not interest or finance charges assessed. The cost for the monthly payment plan is \$25 per semester. Tuition fees may be budgeted by automatic bank payment or credit card option.

WITHDRAWING FROM CLASSES

You may withdraw from a class by selecting “Register and Drop Sections” on EagleNet. Permission from your instructor is not required. Individual sections may be dropped up to 75 percent into the term. Complete withdrawal may be done up until the last day before finals begin. Refer to the refund policy section for refund amount, if applicable. Consult your class syllabus for dates specific to your section.

Beginning your first week of classes: If you terminate participation in your classes and do not withdraw, you will receive “F” grades and your instructor will assign your last date of attendance. This date will determine your financial aid recalculation. You must initiate the withdrawal.

REFUNDS

Changes involving refunds will be computed as of the date they are changed via Internet or received in the One Stop office. As a Kirkwood Community College student, it is your responsibility to follow these procedures. If special circumstances prevent you from following registration procedures as listed, notify the One Stop office.

REFUND POLICY

Students may receive a refund of their tuition according to the following schedule:

Full-semester classes (16 weeks):

100 percent of tuition	First week of semester
50 percent of tuition	Second week of semester

Half-semester classes (8 weeks):

100 percent of tuition	First three days of classes
50 percent of tuition	Second three days of classes

The exceptions to this policy are classes that meet only once, twice or only one weekend. There is no refund for these classes beginning the day of the first class meeting.

The last day to exchange classes of equal hours at no additional charge is the end of the second week of the course start date. Students must obtain faculty and dean approval (signatures) prior to exchanging a class if the semester is in session or if the desired class is full. Changes involving refunds will be computed as of the date they are changed via Internet or received in the One Stop office.

All refunds are based on tuition only. Financial aid recipients who withdraw from all classes are subject to refund guidelines stipulated in the Higher Education Act. Contact the Financial Aid office at 319-398-7600 for the appropriate schedule. Tuition refunds for complete withdrawals for students receiving financial aid are returned to financial aid.
