Chair Pearson called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

No public comments.

Chair Pearson declared the public hearing open at 4:31 pm regarding the FY27 proposed budget and noted that approval of the FY27 budget would occur under New Business later in the meeting. Hearing no questions or comments, Trustees Jensen and Thys moved and seconded the public hearing be closed at 4:32 p.m. Motion carried: 8-0.

**Student Perspectives**

Carla Andorf, Executive Director–Skills to Employment, introduced former student Einas Ibrahim. Einas began at Kirkwood in 2015, completing English Language Acquisition coursework before earning her Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts in May 2020. She continued pursuing nursing, completing CNA training at Kirkwood with GAP tuition assistance and receiving support through the Federal WIOA Title I program, including tuition, books, mileage, and ongoing guidance.

Through dedication and perseverance, Einas earned her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Mount Mercy University after the Fall 2025 semester, passed the NCLEX on her first attempt, and began employment with University of Iowa Health Care on March 23, 2026, earning a strong wage to support her family.

**INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

**Kirkwood Report**

Justin Hoehn, Director of Media Relations and Communications, provided the Kirkwood report, which included:

- The Spring 2026 County Leadership Council meetings kicked off this week, with sessions held Monday in Jones County and Wednesday in Cedar County.
- The Kirkwood Foundation has officially announced the public launch of The Community’s College – The Community’s Future, a comprehensive \$15 million fundraising campaign.
- Kirkwood has released the Skills 2027 Report, offering a regional snapshot of workforce needs informed by feedback from 156 employers across the college’s seven-county service area.

- Nine Kirkwood students participated in the Seven Bridges Project, an international collaboration connecting students and businesses throughout the United States and Europe to tackle real-world business challenges.
- Kirkwood Head Women's Basketball Coach Kim Muhl announced his retirement after 37 seasons at the helm of the Eagles, concluding one of the most successful coaching careers in junior college basketball history.

### **Phi Theta Kappa All Iowa Academic Team Students**

Bryant Manning, Associate Dean of Arts & Humanities, introduced Kirkwood's 2026 Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) All-Iowa Academic Team honorees. As part of Leadership in Action Week, twelve outstanding Kirkwood students were recognized last month at the PTK Awards Celebration in Des Moines. In recognition of their achievements, the Kirkwood Board of Trustees awarded a scholarship valued at \$379 to honorees: Jennifer Smith, Jason Jaeger, Kaleigh Keeney, Julia Love Blozovich, Tristan Hancock, De'Jah Jordan, Caylee Van Donkelaar, Jiajia Wu, Emmi Huston, Jeremie Nkola, Amanda Behrends (not in attendance), and Sawyer Keehner (not in attendance).

### **Radiological Technology Program**

Kendra Lindloff, Dean of Health, introduced Rochelle Holt, Program Director of the Radiologic Technology Program. Lindloff provided an update on the program's status and reported strong early interest, noting that a program conference held in March was attended by 30 prospective students. She further indicated that the program is planned to launch in Fall 2027, pending submission and review of required documentation by the Department of Education and the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT).

### **Legislative Update**

Jasmine Almoayyed, Vice President-Government & Community Relations, provided an overview of current property tax bill proposals. SF 2474, which passed the Iowa Senate 41-4, restructures multiple elements of property taxation, including eliminating the rollback and using CPI to adjust to property tax caps. The bill includes fixed-rate but excludes variable-rate levies. By contrast, HF 2745 would introduce a total growth cap of 2% on all property taxes, including both fixed and variable levies.

Community Colleges are currently advocating either to be exempt from the total growth cap-similar to school districts-or to exclude variable levies from the cap. The House bill has not yet been placed on the calendar floor debate, and negotiations between the two chambers are expected to begin in the coming weeks. The Board was provided with an estimate of the proposal's potential impacts using a five-year look back.

Both chambers now have their budget targets and are working through line-item funding before bringing the bills forward for debate.

The IEDA omnibus bill remains active and does not include the amendment to remove the 260E language.

The 100-day deadline for the legislative session is April 21st, and the session is expected to continue beyond that date.

### **Financial Report**

Treasurer Dunning provided a high-level review of changes to the FY26 projected revenues for operating Fund 1 at the April 2026 Board meeting for the period of July 2025 through February 2026. Through February 2026, credit tuition is projected to exceed budget by \$1.22M. Credit tuition projection has been updated to include revenues of both college credit in high school academies and spring semester regular enrollment. Investment income is projected to exceed budget by \$1.02M due to higher-than-expected interest rates. Overall, actual revenue is projected to exceed budget revenue by \$2.35M.

Overall expenses for operating Fund 1 are projected to remain within budget for FY26. Key expense savings include Salaries and Benefits savings of \$2.23M due to savings from unfilled open positions.

Fund 3 is projected to end the year in line with budget. A more refined estimate for the enterprise operations will be presented later when a larger share of operating revenues has been received at the major enterprises.

Cash balances remain strong with the College having 156 days of unrestricted days reserve at the end of March 2026, when compared to a KPI of 90 days.

Treasurer Dunning provided a review of the College's FY27 proposed budget to be submitted to the State of Iowa. Within the proposed budget, the general fund reflects the operating revenue and expenditures of Kirkwood in the College's unrestricted fund and restricted fund accounts. The general fund budget for FY27 is a surplus of \$4.79M with revenues exceeding expenditures to address a fund balance deficit in the restricted fund. The plant fund budget is used to pay for construction projects. The plant fund budget for FY27 is a proposed deficit budget of \$2.00M using accumulated fund balances to pay for construction costs on campus and ongoing debt service payments. The bond & interest fund is used to pay the principal and interest on general obligation bond debt and is set to a surplus budget of \$567,884. Surplus levy funds of \$515,000 will be deposited into an escrow account during FY27 to be held to partially call School Bonds Series 2020C effective June 2028.

Treasurer Dunning also provided a review of the College's proposed property tax levies for FY27. For FY27 taxable valuations have increased 3.5%, which is greater than the five-year average of 3.2%. FY27 property tax levy rate will remain flat at a rate of \$1.43000 per \$1,000 valuation. Comparing the FY27 property tax revenue increase of \$1.66M is less than the five-year average of \$2.04M.

Trustees Doerge and Williams moved and seconded approval of the Fiscal Year 2026-2027 budget and setting total tax rate per \$1,000 valuation at \$1.43000. Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Caves and Bannon moved and seconded approval for the publication of the amended budget for Fiscal Year 2025-2026 and setting the date of May 14, 2026, for the Public Hearing. Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Doerge and Stamp moved and seconded authorizing the partial call of Lease Purchase Certificates of Participation Series 2017B and authorizing expenditure of unrestricted cash for the partial call of Series 2017B. Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Williams and Bannon moved and seconded approval of tuition rates for AY2026-27 at \$229.00/per credit hour for Iowa residents, \$306.00/per credit hour for non-residents, and \$400.00/per credit hour for international students.
