#### MINUTES

Chair Mollenhauer called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

Trustees Pearson and Thys moved and seconded approval of the minutes from the meetings held on July 13, 2023 and directed them to be made a part of the permanent record. Motion carried: 9-0.

#### **INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

#### **Kirkwood Report**

Justin Hoehn, Director of Media and Legislative Relations, provided the Eagle Update and Kirkwood report, which included:

- Classes begin on August 21. Faculty and staff are busy preparing for the upcoming fall semester. Kirkwood's campuses will soon be alive with activity as students return in order to pursue their academic goals. - The Kirkwood's Eagles volleyball team will start the season with a new head coach David Brown. Soon after his hire in April, Coach Brown has been preparing for the 2023 campaign. The season officially begins on August 18 versus Gulf Coast State College at a tournament in Rockford, Illinois.
- August Student of the Month: Alison Jansen. Alison is originally from Bozeman, Montana. She is from a military family and moved a lot in her younger years. She has lived in places like Washington State and Utah before landing in Cedar Rapids. Alison graduated from Kennedy High School in 2020 and enrolled at Kirkwood in the fall. She also attended the Patient Care Academy at Linn County Regional Center. She is currently enrolled in the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program. In five years, Alison plans to move to Omaha with hopes to work in a pediatric setting. She plans on pursing a bachelor's degree in either childhood development or psychology.
- Students from Kirkwood's Industrial Tech department demonstrated some incredible knowledge and understanding in their fields at the 2023 SkillsUSA National Leadership & Skills Conference in Atlanta this year. Dan Gustafson won a gold medal in the Electronics technology category and Spencer Speral brought home a silver medal in Automotive Service Technology.
- Kirkwood's Nursing department received some excellent news recently. The latest NCLEX scores were
  released and the Kirkwood Nursing program is once again among the best in the state. Kirkwood
  scored a perfect 100 percent pass rate for the ADN program; 44 out of 44 Kirkwood graduates passed.
  So far this year, out of the 90 graduates of the program who have taken the test, 89 have passed.
  Those incredible numbers have once again made Kirkwood the #1 community college in the state
  when it comes to the NCLEX pass rate.

- KICK camp enrollments have surpassed last year's totals by nearly 5%. There have been 1,220 registrations to-date this year. 135 in-person and 46 online camps have been offered in multiple locations for area youth to attend, have fun, keep their mind's learning, and hopefully avoid the dreaded summer slide.
- The Hotel at Kirkwood is part of the Preferred Hotels and Resorts group, which represents independent hotels, resorts, and residences, across 85 countries. Jackie Bohr, General Manager, recently received rankings based on surveys and guest reviews:
  - The Hotel is ranked #2 out of the entire portfolio of 550 Preferred hotels and resorts.
  - It's also ranked #2 out of the 190 hotels and resorts in the North America Region.
  - AND the Hotel is ranked #1 out of the 25 properties in our territory.

#### **Financial Report**

Treasurer Drew provided a high-level review of the cash balance report. Typically, the months of July and August have seen decreases in cash balances due to less revenue being collected during these months, annual payments paid at being of new fiscal year, and reimbursements from fiscal year end not being received until September.

The college has established a baseline for unrestricted days of cash reserve at 75 days. The official unrestricted days of cash reserves is with CARES funding since the requirements for CARES have already been met by the college and these funds are now unrestricted. Currently, we are tracking unrestricted days of cash reserve with CARES funding and without CARES funding. By showing both we can show how unrestricted cash reserves are spent once the excess funds created by CARES are spent down. As of July 2023, the college has 97 days of unrestricted days of cash reserves which exceeds the board approved 75 days.

The college receives approximately \$10.7M in federal and state grants combined. The majority of the grants pay for personnel and operating cost to administer the programs.

The college has \$163.6M in outstanding debt as of June 30, 2023. This represents approximately 7% of the debt capacity of the college.
