MINUTES

Chair Mollenhauer called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

No public comments.

Trustees Jensen and Pearson moved and seconded approval of the nomination to appoint Peggy Doerge to serve as District VIII Director, effective January 11, 2024, for the duration of the current term set to expire November 2025. Motion carried: 7-0.

Chair Mollenhauer gave the Oath of Office to newly appointed District III Trustee, Peggy Doerge.

Trustees Wright and Caves moved and seconded approval of the minutes from the meeting held on December 7, 2023, and directed them to be made a part of the permanent record. Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Stamp and Williams moved and seconded approval of the January 11, 2024 agenda. Motion carried: 8-0

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

Kirkwood Report

Justin Hoehn, Director of Media and Legislative Relations, provided the Eagle Update and Kirkwood report, which included:

- Kirkwood Alert is an emergency notification program that enables the college to provide the Kirkwood community with critical information quickly in a variety of situations such as severe weather, college closures and other threats. To sign up for this service, visit www.Kirkwood.edu/publicsafety.
- Kirkwood will be hosting Crowd the Court, an annual event designed to show potential students what it's like to be an Eagle. The visit experience gives high school juniors and seniors a chance to explore Kirkwood and see some exciting Eagle athletes as well. All high school seniors who attend, will be entered to win one of two full-tuition scholarships worth up to 15 credits per semester for an entire year. - Student of the month: Mariam Nawar. Mariam was born in Arizona after both of her parents immigrated from the middle east. She and her family moved to lowa over 10 years ago. Mariam chose Kirkwood for a variety of reasons wanting to save her family as much money as possible and because of the amazing faculty and Kirkwood's passion to help students succeed. She is an Engineering Transfer Major and plans to pursue a degree in biomedical engineering.
- The Kirkwood Esports teams recently competed in the National Association of Collegiate
 Esports StarLeague Tournament and did well! The college had four teams with a total of 16
 students competing in four different esports. Three of those teams went undefeated for the
 entirety of the semester, including playoffs, and two of them also won their finals games,
 earning first place in their respective divisions.
- The eighth-ranked Kirkwood men's basketball team is 14-2, including a 5-1 conference record, and are currently in 3rd place in the Iowa Community College Athletic Conference.
- The women's basketball team is currently ranked fourth in the country with a record of 15-2. The Eagles are 6-1 in conference games, which is good enough for second place in the ICCAC.
- The Hotel at Kirkwood Center was awarded the Bump Elliott Appreciation Award last Sunday at the Iowa Hawkeye Football annual awards banquet. The Hotel received the award for "for exceeding expectations and providing exemplary professionalism and expertise when taking care of hosting and feeding the Iowa Hawkeyes since 2011."
- The Corridor Business Journal's annual Corridor Leaders 250 recently came out. The publication honors the region's most influential business leaders. Both Continuing Education and Training Services Vice President, Jasmine Almoayyed and President Kristie Fisher made the list in the Education and Ed Tech category.

Public Safety Priorities

Andrew MacPherson, Associate Vice President of Public Safety, provided a comprehensive review of Kirkwood Public Safety over the past three years. Topics covered included KPI's, Goals, and personnel in the Public Safety, Emergency Management, and Environmental Health Safety programs.

Financial Report

Treasurer Drew provided a high-level review of changes to the FY24 projected revenues at the January 2024 board meeting for the period of July 2023 thru November 2023. Thru November 2023, credit tuition is exceeding budget by \$3M and contract training & non-credit tuition is exceeding budget by \$951K.

Overall, actual revenue is projected to exceed budget revenue by \$3.8M; however, we still have nine months remaining in fiscal year 2024 so projections can change based on actual activity in future months.

Overall expenses for operating fund 1 are projected to remain within budget for FY24. Revenue received from previous fiscal years to pay for CCTC / equity coaches / AMT program will be allocated to those programs if net income from fiscal year 2024 cannot cover those cost.

Cash balances remain very strong with the College having 112 days of unrestricted days reserve at the end of November 2023, and 110 days of unrestricted days reserve at the end of December 2023, when compared to a KPI of 75 days.
