MINUTES

Chair Mollenhauer called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

No public comments.

Trustees Stamp and Wright moved and seconded approval of the minutes from the meetings held on June 8, 2023 and directed them to be made a part of the permanent record. Motion carried: 8-0.

Trustees Thys and Doerge moved and seconded approval of the July 13, 2023 agenda. Motion carried: 8-0.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

Kirkwood Report

Justin Hoehn, Director of Media and Legislative Relations, provided the Eagle Update and Kirkwood report, which included:

- Kirkwood Interactive Camps for Kids, or KICK camps, are exciting and educational summer camps for youth ages 8-15. Each camp is designed around career exploration, while providing fun, hands-on activities that promise to develop and build key skills for future success. For more information, go to www.kirkwood.edu/kick.
- All incoming students at Kirkwood attend orientation. Orientation helps new students learn
 everything they need to succeed and transition smoothly to college. This summer at Kirkwood, like
 every summer, new student orientation dates have been scheduled to help the newest members of
 the Kirkwood community get ready for their first classes. Each session is designed to make sure
 students are ready to hit the ground running right from the get go.
- Student of the month: Luc Puis. Luc is from Tervuren, Belguim [a small town near Brussels]. After high school, Luc attended the Erasmus College of Nursing in Brussels and started working as an ICU nurse. He eventually moved on to become a cardiovascular perfusionist for a little over a decade, before his work brought him to the US. He eventually permanently moved here and married his now wife. Unfortunately, his certificates and diplomas were obtained in Belgium, and none of those degrees were recognized in the US. So, he made his way to Kirkwood and the Respiratory Therapy program and says the people he's met, along with his classes, have made his back-to-school experience a good one. Luc is a member of the Phi Theta Kappa honor society and helps tutor his fellow students when he can.
- Kirkwood's Global Learning department was recently made aware that three Kirkwood employees
 were named Fulbright Scholars by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural
 Affairs. The Fulbright Program is the United States government's flagship program of international
 educational and cultural exchange. It's primarily funded by Congress with additional funding from
 participating governments and host institutions, corporations, and foundations in foreign countries.

The individuals at Kirkwood who were chosen to receive a Fulbright U.S. Scholar fellowship included: Ryan Dehner-Mexico, Shannon Ingleby-Japan, and James Trepka-Barbados.

- The Aviation Maintenance Technology program has received Federal Aviation Administration approval to become a certified aviation maintenance school. The certification, in conjunction with approval from the Iowa Department of Education, signifies that the program can officially enroll students and classes can begin this fall.
- The Kirkwood Foundation, in partnership with the Alumni Leadership Council, is proud to announce
 the launch of the Kirkwood Alumni-Owned Business Directory. You can browse the growing list of
 alumni-owned businesses by going to the college's website and searching for "alumni directory".
- The Hotel at Kirkwood Center has received its 12th consecutive AAA Four Diamond award. The Hotel is the only Four Diamond award winner in Cedar Rapids and one of only four such properties in all of lowa.

Accreditation

Megan Thole, Director Institutional Planning, provided an overview of AY22/23 accreditation activities, a summary of the Multi-Location Visit results, and a status update on the Higher Learning Commission's Comprehensive Visit scheduled for October 2-3, 2023.

Summer 2022 Enrollment Update

Jon Buse, VP of Student Services reported on the current enrollment for the summer 2023 term based on the weekly enrollment report prepared by Institutional Effectiveness on July 10, 2023.

Summer 2023 enrollment is 3,940 students enrolled in 22,539 credit hours. Student headcount is flat with summer 2022 and credit hours decreased by 2% over the same period. Given the small overall summer enrollment and credit hours, a 2% decrease is a very small number. Overall, summer enrollment is remaining steady, and the only notable change over last year is an increase in online enrollment of 5% or 119 students.

Buse also briefed the board on Fall 2023 enrollment status. Fall enrollment continues to run ahead of the pace set for Fall 2022 on the analogous date by a total of 7%. While this is a positive sign, we have front loaded orientation for new students and we expect the enrollment for fall new students to flatten as we move through July. Overall, leadership assesses that the enrollment goals set in our FY 2024 budget are well within target at this time. We are monitoring fall enrollment closely and discussing weekly at cabinet.

Financial Report

Treasurer Drew provided a high-level review of changes to the FY23 projected revenues at the July 2023 board meeting for the period of July 2022 thru May 2023. Thru May 2023 credit tuition, foundation transfer, fees, and sales & services are trending below budget.

Overall revenue is projected to be \$158K below FY23 revenue budget. Key items impacting FY23 revenues include lower credit revenue of \$1.4M and decrease in food & beverage sales of \$216K related to the hotel and campus café. This decline in revenue is being offset by increases in revenue related to increased enrollment for contracted training and non-credit tuition (\$640K) and increase in investment income revenue (\$1.4M).

Overall expenses are projected to decrease \$1.8M when compared to FY24 expense budget. Key items impacting FY23 expenses include wages and benefits decreasing \$2.5M due to open positions currently not filled. Operating expenses are projected to be \$527K below budget and non-operating expenses are projected to be \$1.2M above budget.

Overall, the FY23 operating budget is at breakeven, prior to the transfer of \$18M to the Kirkwood Foundation and use of HEERF funding in the amount of \$900K (both these items are being funded from revenue collected in previous fiscal years).

Cash balances remain very strong with the College having 100 days of cash on hand, excluding an additional 15 days of CARES cash on hand when compared to a KPI of 75 days.
