Program Description

Prepare for a career that provides professional technical support to veterinarians, biomedical researchers, and other scientists. Technicians in this field will care for hospitalized patients; assist the doctor in surgery; perform physical exams, lab work, and technical procedures (blood draws, IV placement); take health histories and X-rays; induce and monitor anesthesia; provide client education; and perform reception duties.

As a Veterinary Technician student you'll work with a variety of animals, including dogs, cats, horses, cows, pigs, sheep, birds, snakes, guinea pigs, hamsters, and rats. A strong background in biological sciences is needed for this program.
